From Principal Dr. Murphy

Dear Parents, Guardians and Friends of Beacon Hill International School,

It is hard to believe that the school year is nearly over. There are very few days left until summer vacation, but they are packed full of important learning opportunities and, in many cases, a chance to pull all that learning together in a final, cumulative project.

During the June 2nd Celebration of the Arts you will see, for example, samples of all the work that students have done in art class throughout the year. Every child will have at least one piece of art work on display. The range of art projects is phenomenal. The fourth and fifth grade instrumental music students will perform, showing all that they have learned across the year. And the first graders will present a ribbon dance as a culmination of their social studies unit on China. On another evening, fifth graders will be sharing their Notables Projects. Each student researched a notable person, wrote a report, created a poster and will deliver a speech in the voice of their notable individual. This project is a combination of academic research and artistic understanding. life and the impact that this life had on others. In a couple of weeks the fourth graders will be presenting dramatic productions of a book they read. This is the culmination of an extensive spring Book-It Theatre Workshop. On another evening, one of the fourth grade classes will be presenting research on their country of origin to their parents. There are more culminating events, but this gives you a flavor of the important learning that continues on through June 19th.

June, the last month of the school year, is also a time to look back and express our gratitude to everyone who helped make this year such a success. Parents and teachers, staff and volunteers have all contributed enormous amounts of time and energy to help students make academic progress. There is no way to thank everyone, but I would like to expressly thank Nancy Fujimoto for all her help and support this year. Nancy is a catalyst for many things that happen at Beacon Hill across the year. She brings in volunteers, helps them find a niche that contributes their special strengths to the school community and makes everyone feel welcome and appreciated. Fortunately for us, Nancy is planning to be back next year to keep us all organized!

There are, however, a number of folks who won't be returning next year. Certainly the fifth graders will be moving on to middle school.

They will be missed, but there is a world out there waiting for their gifts. The fifth grade parents, the ones who will no longer have students here at Beacon Hill, will also be missed. Nantes Howe, for example, who has produced this PTA newsletter for the past four years, will be moving on with her daughter, Seanna.
